Programme Title:	English Pronunciation Clinic for Intermediate Students
Programme Nature:	This course will assist students who have problems with their pronunciation, intonation, and linkage. Students will have individual sessions where they will receive feedback on their pronunciation as well as designing individual strategies for self-learning.
	 15mins of individual pronunciation sessions will be arranged for 3-4 students in each lesson; each student will get a total of 2 individual sessions in the course of the whole course There will be short period of teaching time (45mins) and a focus on native speech patterns in classroom practice, using drills in stress, rhythm tone and intonation
	Pedagogical notes : This course will be based on the general education concept of whole person learning which encourages the co-creation of knowledge and skills. Experiential learning techniques will be used to facilitate students' overall development as well as their language development. The individual sessions will be learning clinics where we focus on a student's current starting place, the way they learn best, and ways to help them reach their goals. There will be a focus on how their learning has been impacted by COVID, along with a design of strategies to catch up through linking to Campus programmes and other resources.
